#### MILITARY METERS

Wilf Whitehouse reports a new military item: Type 7.3, meter no. 83869 used at TORONTO on may 30'41. Slogan to left reads #1 Air Training Command Toronto Ontario. This is a new early date for a military meter updating the listing and article in CMSG Newsletter 3.

#### NEW CATALOGUE STYLE

Several members have written indicating support for retention of Irwin's system wherever possible for classification; a loose-leaf unbound version is preferable; spacing after listings to permit addition of new reports; Postal Directives, operator errors, Postal Rates, should not be included in classification listing - perhaps being left as separate sections on a second page or whatever; townlists and certainly Province spellings, variaties, postal station varieties might be listed where short enough (such as lists compiled so far in Newsletters 1-9; listing of serial block sequences should be retained.

#### DRAVES NEW TOWN LIST

Alan Draves has updated the Canada Meter Town List through MSS Bulletin No. 181. Ask for a copy including \$1-2 to cover costs. The new publication is described below. (SS)

#### CANADA METER TOWN LIST

This Canada Town List is published by Alan Draves, Box 190, New Knoxville OH 45871. It lists all towns known to have appeared on Canadian postage meters.

All towns on this list have been listed in Meter Stamp Society Bulletins. The list includes towns reported through Bul. 181. The spellings used are from the 1980/1981 Canadian Postal Directories, which differ from previously reported spellings in a few cases. For discontinued post offices, the actual spelling used in the townmark is used if known, otherwise the spelling is taken from the MSS Bulletins.

The list does not include any stations or branches, nor does it include errors and varieties. It is planned to incorporate these at a later date.


Any town you have that is not listed should be reported to Alan Draves at the above address, so it may be added to the list. New towns will be listed in the MSS Bulletin, and will be provided to the Canadian Meter Study Group, as well as being included in an updated town list. MSS and CMSG members will receive credit for new town reports if they include their organization name (and membership number if applicable) with all new town reports.

The EXACT spelling shown in the townmark should be given in all new town reports, as well as the meter number (if legible). The reporter may be requested to send a photocopy of towns which do not appear in postal directories, or which appear with a different spelling.

A listing of the Parliament franks and the Return Postage townmarks has been added to the end of the list.

#### WIRING METERS

Ernest Merriken recently pointed out the existence in Canada of meters used to measure lengths of copper wiring in motor rewinding (armature) shops. They issue tapes, with red impressions from the Underwiter's Laboratories Inc. A box incentre reads APPLIANCE WIRING MATERIAL with date M/D/Y at left and length in FEET at right. They are PB machines. One for instance is meter 2934 used on JAN -3'80 for 500 FEET of wire. Can anyone tell us some more about these?



#### WIRING METER EXAMPLE

The editor has seen a second example dated AUG 27'72 on meter (tape) no. 2516 for 2000 FEET of wiring.

#### OXFAM METERS

#### POSTAGE DUE METERS

The illustration in No. 9 of a Vancouver Postage Due (Irwin type 17) meter triggered the question: has anyone listed all known Canadian PD meters? In Newsletter No.6 (page 10) we illustrated a possible PD meter in use in Montreal. However there are also the following:

- Type 17: 149991 TORONTO ONTARIO CANADA at Station A (previously numbered 149201).
  149995 VANCOUVER B.C. 149996 blank TM used at Vancouver
- Type 11: 151981 TORONTO ONTARIO with POSTAGE DUE in vertical box at left 143426 TORONTO ONTARIO P O as above at Postal Station B. (These two are illustrated in MSS Bulletin 164:p.3 1978. reported by G. Pustel in 1978)
  - 146403 TORONTO ONTARIO P O (see MSS Bulletin 166:7 (1979)
    143426 as above with P O removed after 1975 approximately.
    159405 TORONTO ONTARIO at Commerce Court Postal Station
    (reported by D. Cooper)
- Type 20.2 565387 MONTREAL P.Q. as noted in CMSG Newsletter 6.
- Type 22.3 775374 POSTAGE DUE TORONTO ONT. 775780 TORONTO ONT. POSTAGE DUE
- Type 40.3 137 TORONTO(See Irwin's article in Canada Stamp News Dec26/77)
- Type 41.5 729 and 739 WINNIPEG MAN.

Types 40.3 and 41.5 are the rarest but I have never seen any of the type 11's described above. Are there others??


#### CHRISTMAS SLOGANS
