The Postal History Society of Canada

Originally founded in 1972 as the Postal History Society of Ontario, our name was changed in 1977 to reflect the expanded nature and scope of our interests. The PHSC is a non-profit organization that promotes the study of Canadian postal history and communication among members at all levels of expertise. We invite you to be part of this adventure into postal history.

Currently, the Society publishes an award-winning, 72-page quarterly, the *PHSC Journal*. Contents include a balance from fully-researched feature articles to items of current interest on the full spectrum of BNA postal history – from the pre-stamp era through the various postmark specialities, postal rates and routes, and regional histories. We encourage postal historians and members of the Society to share their knowledge by submitting articles for publication in the *Journal*.

The Society offers an extensive website containing a wide variety of postal history information and growing searchable reference databases of BNA postal history, developed by members across the country. The databases will ultimately contain complete historical listings of Canadian post offices and detail of most of the postmark types used over the last two centuries. The website also offers a searchable repository of past copies of the *Journal* and many study group newsletters, as well as many other publications and exhibits.

Two awards are offered annually to writers: the *Stan Shantz Award* is presented to the author of the article deemed most worthy in the *PHSC Journal*, and the *Frank W. Campbell Award* is awarded for major contributions to the study of BNA postal history in other publications. The *Ritch Toop Memorial Award* is offered annually at national-level exhibitions held in Edmonton and Ottawa, for the best military postal history exhibit of sufficiently high quality. Via its *Allan Steinhart Memorial Fund*, the PHSC also provides support for research in postal history. Several Society study groups are devoted to specialized aspects of postal history.

Each spring, the Society holds an Annual Meeting, accompanied by a postal history seminar given by a prominent member of the Society. Postal history is a significant component of the social history of Canada. We welcome your interest and active participation.
