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# An open letter to fellow postal historians.

There are many postal historians in our region of the three counties of Grey, Bruce, and Simcoe with no apparent common forum to share information. The area is large enough to bring together people of varied background and yet small enough to be meaningful and manageable. I propose that those interested form a P.H.S.C. Study Group and exchange information through the medium of a newsletter covering various topics, both old and current, such as post office profiles, newly


discovered cancelling instruments, interesting advertising corner cards and post cards, postal statistics for any given post office, interesting covers, railway post offices covering the region. In all of these topics the purpose is not to give the definitive answer but rather to seek out information and to build on this information. To that end each item will receive a reference number [e.g., REF. 001] to which the reader(s) may respond with further information. This reference system has been successfully tried by the *Northern Canada Study Group*.

The cost of such an endeavour can be quite reasonable and I suggest a charge of \$5.00 per year to cover postage and reproduction of the newsletter. I suggest a frequency of 4 issues per year. I am willing to assemble and co-ordinate this newsletter for the time being and have had some experience in dealing with this form of study group.



# The Post Office at Camperdown Collingwood Towship, County of Grey

[REF. 005] Now just a few farms and a ski club, the CNR flag stop at Camperdown was located in Collingwood Township, Grey County, on the southern shore of Nottawasaga Bay (Georgian Bay) halfway between Craigleith and Thornbury. In its lifetime the post office had only two postmasters having been first opened on November 1, 1887 and finally closing January 15, 1964. James Barclay Sr. was

Camperdown's first postmaster from opening day until October 15, 1924. James Barclay Jr. was appointed postmaster December 1, 1924, upon his father's death, and held that position until the closing of the post office in 1964. At that time Camperdown postal service became a part of RR2 Clarksburg.

The first mail carrier on record (pre-dating the post office at Camperdown) was a lad of 18 surnamed Lunan from the east side of the township above the mountain.

For many years the mail was delivered daily by the Grand Trunk/CNR passenger train. The train, originating in Hamilton and ending in Meaford, reached its destination via Georgetown, Caledon, Beeton, Tottenham, Allandale, Stayner, Collingwood, Craigleith, Camperdown, Thornbury and Meaford.

Georgian Bay Summer Resort


began its life as a sanatorium in the early 1870's.

In 1874-1875 the property was purchased by Thomas Fields who ran the popular summer resort under the name of "Delphi". The above post card promises daily mail at Camperdown.

The resort business at Camperdown declined by the end of the 19th century and only with the advent of skiing has it had a resurgence.






[REF. 008] A seemingly uninteresting cover from Collingwood, Ontario, has a story of its own to tell. It was mailed March 19, 1884 to S. R. Eagles, Esq., Bay View P.O., St. Vincent. The St. Vincent, of course, is the St. Vincent Township in the County of Grey which surrounds the Town of Meaford. Bayview P.O. was

located just west of Meaford in the vicinity of Hwy. 26. The Bayview post office was opened February 1, 1873 and closed December 30, 1914 at a time when many rural routes were established. More amazing is the backside of the envelope. It is in effect an advertising cover for the Town of Collingwood. It is worth printing the text herewith and comparing it with the modern Town of Collingwood in 1998.
