With the annual holiday season upon us, the CMSG mailbox seemed full and warranting another Newsletter which hopefully will arrive to you in the first week of the new year. I hope 1985 brings you all health and happiness. From your Editor and wife Leslie and the two girls the very best to you.

This newsletter brings an update to the wartime patriotic slogan listing included as Miscellaneous Publication No. 1, the first in a research report series for our members. No. 2 will come with the next newsletter as a provisional military listing bringing the draft circulated with newsletter No. 3 up-to-date as much as is possible. Also some information on the American Meter Postage Society, completion of Ross Irwin's listing of meters in use up to 1933 and numerous odds and ends.

AMPS

In newsletter no. 13 we illustrated a cover from the American Metered Postage Society meeting in Windsor in 1964 and asked for the story behind it. Ernest Roscoe has obliged us with our thanks!! The AMPS issued numerous "Bulletins" starting in 1935 under the guidance of Mr. Henry C. Meisel resident in Rockford Illinois. The organization gained rapidly in membership, Meisel reporting as AMPS Editor in Aug 12/52 after 7 months of existence that it had reached 125 members. When Meisel died in the late 1960's, its membership was claimed to be 1200. Ernest Roscoe has discussed Meisel in two columns in Stamp Collector magazine of Jan. 13 and Feb. 10 1979. Meisel appears to have solely written, edited and reproduced the AMPS Bulletins. Meisel and his wife were the sole officers of the AMPS also. He often included writings having nothing to do with meters in his Bulletins so it appears it was for his own amusement. Roscoe notes that Meisel illustration of US and foreign meters was useful but usually they were included with no explanations or text. The so called Annual Meeting in Detroit appears to a manufactured cover for a prominent stamp show at the time and location in 1964. Meisel produced similar items in other cities by leasing a local meter for a few days. AMPS members received copies of the cover and could buy more at a nominal fee. Wilf Whitehouse has sent to us the two illustrations on the next page for AMPS meetings in Windsor in 1964: Second Canada Meeting Mar 31/64, Special Meeting (First Meeting Held Outside USA) on Oct 10, 1964. This appears funny since in our last Newsletter we illustrated a cover for the Third AMPS Canada Meeting of Oct. 10 /64. At any rate, the whole AMPS story looks weird but interesting.

PATRIOTIC SLOGANS

Wilf Whitehouse has contributed a reorganized version of the wartime patriotic meter slogan listing first circulated in newsletters 4 and 5. The listing includes the number of reports and early and late dates of use observed. The list includes 122 illustrated types with reports of numbers seen ranging from 103 for type WS-1 to nil for 14 different types. Some 71 types have only been reported 5 times or less so it could be reasonable that many patriotic slogans from 1940-48 are quite rare. However, these reports are based only on a limited number of collections. More reports would help.

This list rearranges a few items in the miscellaneous slogans section and provides better illustrations of most. Many thanks to Wilf for his studious effort! The item MP-59F is interesting. Does it refer to the 9th Victory Bond/Loan drive? Why are there no 6th-8th slogans in that series? An item illustrated as MP-50 previously is not included. It read "Gone Active/ It's Hard To Buy A/ ROYAL/Typewriter/ But You Can Rent One". Does this count as "patriotic"?

MSS

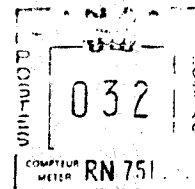

These could be poorly manufactured date slugs of "a new variety". Comments? The Bulletin also includes a review of the Yan Philatelic (Y. Legris author) 1984 Canada Meter and Permit Postage Stamps Specialized Catalogue.

ASLEEP AT NEOPOST??

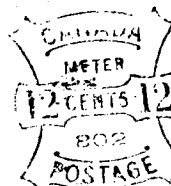
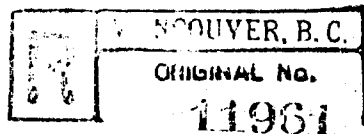

ODDS AND ENDS

W. Whitehouse (again a nice note to the Editor) notes that he can confirm the 20¢ rate in Irwin Type 6, meter no. 40410 used at Calgary in 1937. He also includes the photostat below of an Irwin Type 3.1, no. 802, single 12¢ rate with broken inner circle, prov. abbreviated. This is rare on type 3.1 but common on 3.2, 3.3 and 3.4. Further meter no. 802 was overhauled in 1930 changing from a type 3.3.1 (M802) to a type 3.3.2.

METER POST BOXES INTRODUCED

Perhaps I'm going blind, but I was surprised to see a new type of mailbox on the streets of Victoria, B.C. during the week of December 18, 1984. They are the new Canada Post standard box design, but instead of being red they are light blue and read "Metered Mail Only". They outnumber regular mail boxes in downtown Victoria 2 to 1. Is this something new, a test city or are they everywhere now?? (CR).

NCR LIST

Ross Irwin notes the NCR list circulated in Newsletter no. 8 is a bit ambiguous due to typing short-cuts. The town name should have been typed each time to be clear. Where a register type is listed, it is to be attributed to the town headed above. Ross also reveals that the ALERT NWT town name was actually used for a meter at Alert but we'll "believe it when we see it".

POSTALIA SPECIMEN SLOGAN

The August edition of the MSS Bulletin was mailed from Thunder Bay Ont. by Dave Cooper using a Postalia Meter with a company slogan in German. My copy is very faint; could we get a clear, dark version for illustration Dave? Many thanks.
