EDITOR'S NOTES

This issue of CMSN will feature the Pitney Bowes fractional meter with indicia 156000 and 163000. These are different meter models but the appearance of the indicia is the same. I need some help with this series. Why is it the newer series are always more difficult to find?

I obtained from the US General Accounting Office a copy of "Postage Meters - Risk of Significant Financial Loss But Controls are Being Strengthened" dated May 1994. Carnegie Mellon University evaluated the postage meters and concluded the Pitney Bowes Model R meters were subject to abuse and should be withdrawn from the market. Well, you know what hit the fan! This publication displays the attitude of the manufacturers, particularly Pitney Bowes toward their competition and the industry. The pamphlet also contains some technical information. I saw a copy of the actual Carnegie Mellon report but could not borrow it. Very detailed information on each company and postage meter. Maybe it will show up in some library. Keep an eye open for a copy.

In the USA metered mail represents 37.2% of the volume and 45.5% of the total postage revenue. The number of postage meters in use were Pitney Bowes - 1,200,000; Ascom Hasler - 81,000; Friden Neopost - 73,000; Postalia - 18,000.

Rob included a copy of the error "NRC", which could mean National Research Council, but doesn't. This is just another small error common to this type of postage register. However, it is nice to have one all the same. It is printed on a bright orange paper instead of the usual pale yellow.

Dick Staecker, 384 Regal Dr., London, N5Y 1J7 is beavering away on the new MAIL POSTE postage-paid-in-cash indicia. If you have any strange items send him a copy for his catalogue. Many of these are scarcer than some postage meter impressions. Dick hopes to get out a new catalogue next year. There was a market for a couple of hundred for his first edition so there is some interest in this inexpensive area of collecting.

Wilf Whitehouse sent in two strange examples from a Hasler machine. I think these were collected by M. Legris when the mail strike was in full swing. Both are from private mail delivery firms. The unknown private firm dated the cover AUG 10'88. The unclear post office machine cancel is 12 VIII 1988. The cover also went through the OCR cancelling machine.



100 1003 1500 The Grolier cover is of the same origin and includes the Post Par adhesive label.

Post Par must have used a Hasler meter as a register. They used the SPECIMEN townmark and a 30¢ ad stamp. These are certainly collectable items in a postage meter collection. How should they be catalogued? I guess we call them miscellaneous until we get started on our delivery labels.



Before writing up the Pitney Bowes meter shown below can you confirm the starting serial was 1100001? The highest I have found is 1119700. The value is =.43=, I have one 1.35≡. Is this a fractional meter? Any examples? Provinces are two letter except Ontario is ONT. The date mark is very faint and hard to read some look as if it is blank but I expect not. Any other comments on this meter?



PITNEY BOWES FRACTIONAL METERS TYPE 18

Effective April 1, 1964 the Post Office introduced a new rate of postage. It was a fractional rate of $2\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ for the first two ounces for 2,500 pieces of mail delivered in Canada. Mailers were encouraged to use a postage meter, pay 3¢, and ask for a rebate. This created problems for both the Post Office and the users.

The Pitney-Bowes Model RT postage meter, as used in the United States, was a 4-bank meter having four print wheels and was easily adaptable for fractional rates. In Canada the indicia had to include the bilingual POSTES and POSTAGE in the frank. This meant there was only space for three print wheels. As early as January 23, 1964, Pitney-Bowes had asked the Post Office if the die could be redesigned. What actually occurred was the die was enlarged by 3.6 mm to make space for the fourth print wheel. It was named Pitney-Bowes Model RT-7. The fractional meter was used on a Pitney-Bowes Model 4531 mailing machine.

The townmark and datemark are identical to the Pitney-Bowes Model R (Type 11) postage meter although the province is usually in full on early meters. The maple leaf, METER/COMPTEUR and P.B are also identical. The serial number uses a tall thin style numeral up to serial number 156100 where it reverts to the Type 11 serial number style.

The indicia is 23 mm by 51 mm. Postage meter ads are used with this machine. The serial number block begins at 156000.

The fractional rate print wheel had only two printing areas. One was the 3¢ rate and the other was two dots. On the early meters the dots were spaced 2.5 mm apart; however, mixed in with this spacing were a few that had dots 3.5 mm apart.

Beginning about 1969 the dot spacing was increased to 4.5 mm apart. This wide spacing is on postage meters above 156180 where U.S. print wheels having three wavy lines instead of a star are used in front of the value. The significance of the wider spacing of the dots is reported to be that the fractional rate has been removed from the meter. I understand this to be a Model 5310 postage meter. The highest known serial number is 156284.

This meter was used by large mass mail organizations. Thick material in the envelopes and rapid cancelling makes it difficult to find real good collectable copies of this indicia.

The Post Office continued to offer discounted fractional rates to large mailers; however, these rates were no longer just 1/2 but included 0.1, 0.3, 0.7, 0.8¢. Pitney-Bowes offered a converted Model RF postage meter to meet these new rates introduced in 1982.

The Pitney-Bowes Model 0619 was introduced in Canada in late 1982. This meter prints the fractional rate as a decimal. It used a Model 4255 mailing machine base. The serial block begins at 163000. The highest known serial is 163174. The indicia of the Model 0619 is identical to the Model RT-7, except for minor changes to be noted in our catalogue.

ODDS AND ENDS

The FMO HALIFAX indicia was on a cover from the Maritime Museum. Suggests the all naval mail - shore and sea - goes through the one office.




Notice what appears to be an "E" for the date on the meters above. Close examination shows the meter was used for bulk rate and a "-" was used for the day however the guard on the meter appears to add a bit of ink to give the "E" appearance.

The meter indicia shown below is of course a standard meter; however, it appears that bulk mail is imported from the USA and mailed in Canada by TNT at the Toronto Airport. I would have thought the economics would be in the other direction.
