PHSC Symposium 2019 Events

The **full package** includes all events on the **four main days** (July 18-21) of the Symposium, including any catered meals and organized transportation. Please note that for the events at the Dundurn Castle and the Museum of Steam and Technology, transportation will be by carpooling.

Details of Events, day by day:

July 17 "Toronto Postal & History Tour", hosted by Kathy Hartley, reference librarian of the Harry Sutherland Philatelic Library, will be Wednesday July 17. Meet at the Ontario Archives, a short walk from the York University subway stop at 134 Ian MacDonald Blvd., North York. A private tour of the facilities will begin around 10am, and we expect to spend the day there. Please note that one piece of government-issued ID (not a health card!) will be required for admission. Participants are invited to attend the evening meeting of the Philatelic Specialists Society of Canada at the Vincent Graves Greene Philatelic Research Foundation. All costs associated with the bonus day will be covered by each participant on a pay-as-you-go basis, and *there will be a limit of 20 participants*.

July 18 The motor coach will depart the Sheraton in Hamilton at 8:30 and proceed to the Major Mackenzie / Hwy 400 Park & Ride. Those meeting us there should arrive by 9:30. We will visit the SS Keewatin, a Canadian Pacific steamship, in Port McNicoll. Following a tour, we will proceed to Sainte-Marie among the Hurons, where we will enjoy a catered lunch, a tour, a postal history presentation and ample time for exploration. Cocktails at a cash bar and a catered dinner follow.

July 19 Following a postal history presentation at the Hotel, we will proceed (by carpooling) to the Dundurn Castle in Hamilton. There, we will have a catered lunch, admission to the main house and tours and two postal history presentations.

July 20 This is the first day of the Bourse and Exhibition, including a number of presentations and breakout sessions. The Awards Dinner will take place at the nearby Hamilton Museum of Steam and Technology. Transportation will be by carpooling.

July 21 This is the second day of the Bourse and Exhibition, including the PHSC Annual General Meeting, and a number of postal history presentations and breakout sessions.
